
# Welcome to my community

In Rukh Kiri, most people are farmers, but when flash flooding affects harvests, many must seek work in Thailand.

Around 43,000 people live here, in a rural area 72 kilometres from the provincial capital. Health services are poor and far away. Diseases spread quickly due to the lack of clean water and toilets, as well as poor health and hygiene practices.

Many children miss school because their parents either can't afford it or don't understand the importance of education.

**With your help, we'll continue to support children and families here, empowering them to give their children a better future, especially the most vulnerable.**




## Thank you from our staff & volunteers

## Our stories of change

**“Now, I have enough books, and money to pay for my classes...”**

A few years ago, Reaksa felt ashamed that she didn't have school books, money or a bicycle to help her get to school.

Reaksa's father became a member of an agricultural cooperative and was trained in chicken farming. He began to raise chickens at home, selling chickens and eggs for income. Reaksa helps to feed the chickens before school and clean their water pots, and her parents have been able to buy a bicycle and school books from their new income.

“Now, I have enough books, and money to pay for my classes and eat snacks with my friends,” says Reaksa, 12 years old (holding eggs). “In the future, I want to be a teacher.”
